Get your popcorn ready: District 3-4A Division I is top heavy with three regional contenders in Abilene Wylie, Brownwood and Stephenville, and tonight is actually the second leg of the triumvant of games expected to impact the district championship race. The first was a trhiller last Friday - Abilene Wylie 45, Browwood 38... in TRIPLE overtime. Even Stephenville head coach Greg Winder, said it was one of the best high school games he has seen.

He's bbbaaaaaccckkk: Junior running back Krece Nowak is back in action

for Stephenville. He rested basically all of the last three quarters after suffering bruised ribs three at Graham and did not play against Lubbock Monterey. Nowak makes a slight difference - if 1,062 combined rushing and receiving yards and 12 total touchdowns in a hair more than four games can be considered slight. Balanced and often prolific: Brownwood has shown a good balance between run and pass while lighting up a few scoreboards htis season. The Lions average 431.7 yards and 39.5 points per game behind the 14-to-1 touchdowns passing to intercpetions ratio of junior quarterback Tommy Bowden, who has passed

for 1,290 yards while rushing for another 353.

Counteracting matchups: passin Of course, trying to limit that Brownwood offense is a game defense from Stphenville that has not allowed more than three TDs in a game this season (Graham reutrned a kickoff for one of its four). And the Stephenville offense could also cause problemts for the Brownood dfense. The Yellow Jackets average 354.5 yards and 33.7 points, and that was without Easton Jones at quarterback the first two games and without Nowak at running back in the last two.
